Budget

We were able to buy a lot of extra resource to use in the classroom, upgrade our technology, buy two class sets of new students desks, outdoor equipment for students (basketballs, soccer balls, footballs, tennis balls, spike ball etc, kidney table for classes, chairs that needed to be replaced, door mats etc...).
